Hefley, known to me to be a credible citizen of "Cameron, Milam County, Texas, also known to me to be the person whose name is subscribed hereto, and after being duly sworn by me, upon his oath deposes and says.

That my name is W.T. Hefley, that by profession I am an Attorney-at-law; that I have been in the active practice of the law in Cameron, In MilamCounty, Texas, since April 1877 that I have resided continuously in Cameron, Texas, since, 1877 and have practiced law there continually since then until a few years ago when I retired from the practice of law except in special cases.

During the year of 1874 I lived within two miles of Cameron, Milam County, Texas; that I was living within Two miles of Cameron on aril 9th, 1874, that I am well aware of the eventstthat transpired duwing that year and prestically during the early months of said year of 1874.

On April 9th, 1874 the County Court House was destroyed by fire; the fire was at night on the night of Awril 9th, 1874 and completely burned the court house and the records there of. It has been common knowledge among the people that were living here at that time and since; that all of the records that were in the Court House, together with all papers, books records, etc. were all destroyed by fire on the night of April 9th, 1874. If there were any records, papers or other matter saved or taken out of the Court House before, during, or after the fire, I never did hear of it and I have been living here and within two miles of Cameron, Texas, since and before the year 1874.

Owing to the fact that the records were destroyed by fire, and the further fact that many questions arise concerning the burning of the court house as aforesaid and the further fact that those who can make positive cath of the burning of the court house as aforesaid will soon be gone from this earth.
